

Trinity ISE I – Conversation Task Pair Work – Rules and Regulations

STUDENT A

1. You are the **EXAMINER**. You are going to ask the candidate (Student B) some questions about the topic of rules and regulations. Remember, this part of the exam is interactive. The examiner and candidate are both responsible for maintaining a conversation.
2. Before you start, read the questions and think about your own answers.

1. What rules do you have at home?
2. What is your opinion about school uniforms?
3. Is it necessary to have rules when driving a car?
4. Is it ok to use a mobile phone in class?
5. What rules do you have in your English classroom?
6. Do you have any rules about what you eat?
7. What is your opinion about security in airports and when flying?
8. Are there any rules in your home/school/work which you don't think are necessary?
9. If you could, what law would you change?
10. What are the most important rules if you are eating at a restaurant?

3. In the exam you have 2 minutes for the conversation task. Ask your partner some questions from above, but don't talk for more than 2 minutes!
4. After 2 minutes, change roles. Now, you are the **CANDIDATE**. You have 2 minutes to answer the questions that the examiner (Student A) asks you.
5. Change roles again and repeat the task until you don't have any more questions.



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STUDENT B

1. You are the **CANDIDATE**. You have 2 minutes to answer the questions that the examiner (Student A) asks you. Remember, this part of the exam is interactive. The examiner and candidate are both responsible for maintaining a conversation.
2. After 2 minutes, change roles. Now, you are the **EXAMINER**. You are going to ask the candidate (Student B) some questions about the topic of rules and regulations.
3. Before you start, read the questions and think about your own answers.

2. Why are there so many regulations in sports?
3. What are the most important rules when you are at the beach?
4. Are rules and regulations necessary in life?
5. What do you think about the police? Do they do a good job enforcing the law?
6. What school rule would you change if you were in charge?
7. Do you have any personal rules about exercise?
8. What rules and regulations do you know about that are different in other countries?
9. Have you ever broken a rule? Why / Why not?
10. What is the most important rule to teach to children when they are very young?

4. In the exam you have 2 minutes for the conversation task. Ask your partner some questions from above, but don't talk for more than 2 minutes!
5. Change roles again and repeat the task until you don't have any more questions.



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
