

Trinity ISE I – Conversation Task Pair Work – Money

STUDENT A

1. You are the **EXAMINER**. You are going to ask the candidate (Student B) some questions about the topic of money. Remember, this part of the exam is interactive. The examiner and candidate are both responsible for maintaining a conversation.
2. Before you start, read the questions and think about your own answers.

1. What is the last thing you bought?
2. Do you try to save money? What do you save it for?
3. Is it necessary to earn a lot of money to be happy?
4. What would you like to buy, but can't afford at the moment?
5. Is there anything that you feel you spend too much money on?
6. What's your opinion about buying products on the internet?
7. How can money affect relationships?
8. Do you think students should learn how to manage money at school?
9. Have you ever paid for something with your phone?
10. Do you know anyone who is very bad with their money?

3. In the exam you have 2 minutes for the conversation task. Ask your partner some questions from above, but don't talk for more than 2 minutes!
4. After 2 minutes, change roles. Now, you are the **CANDIDATE**. You have 2 minutes to answer the questions that the examiner (Student A) asks you.
5. Change roles again and repeat the task until you don't have any more questions.

STUDENT B

1. You are the **CANDIDATE**. You have 2 minutes to answer the questions that the examiner (Student A) asks you. Remember, this part of the exam is interactive. The examiner and candidate are both responsible for maintaining a conversation.

9. Do you know anyone who is very generous with their money?
10. Have you ever donated money to a charity or NGO?

5. Change roles again and repeat the task until you don't have any more questions.
