The Greatest Showman

Four reviewers give their opinions on the modern musical starring Hugh Jackman.

- A. The Greatest Showman is a visually breath-taking musical that tells the story of P.T. Barnum and the creation of the Barnum & Bailey Circus. The performances by the lead actors are all excellent, and the music is memorable. Although the story may be a bit cliché, it is still a heart-warming and uplifting tale about the power of imagination and the importance of accepting others for who they are. The film's message about chasing your dreams, no matter how impossible they may seem, is especially powerful and resonates with the audience. I would highly recommend this film for anyone looking for an evening of spectacle accompanied by a fantastic soundtrack that will leave you feeling inspired and uplifted.
- B. I found The Greatest Showman to be a bit underwhelming. While the visuals and music are certainly impressive, the story is overly simplistic and the characters lack depth. The film also skims over many of the more controversial aspects of Barnum's life and career, which feels like a sanitized version of history. Additionally, the film's message about inclusivity and acceptance feels forced and preachy accompanied by catchy modern pop tunes. The film's portrayal of the circus, one of the most controversial and debated entertainment of the time, is not deep enough and it fails to explore the darker sides of the industry. I wouldn't recommend this film for anyone looking for a serious historical drama, but it might be suitable for a family movie night.
- C. Films can sometimes leave a lasting impression and this is one of those. The grandiose and spectacular visual effects, combined with an outstanding cast, make it an unforgettable experience. The choreography is outstanding, but I was disappointed with the mostly pop oriented melodies which I found less fitting for the era and setting of the film. The story is a bit predictable, but it is still a heart-warming and entertaining film that celebrates the human spirit and the power of dreams. However, it should be noted that the movie takes a lot of creative liberties with the real history of P.T. Barnum and there are many historical inaccuracies present in the film. It is a good representation of the rags to riches story but it fails to explore the complexities of the man behind it. I highly recommend it to anyone who loves musicals and feel-good films but with the understanding that it's not an accurate representation of the life of P.T. Barnum.
- D. The Greatest Showman is a film that is both visually stunning and emotionally moving. The performances by the lead actors are out of this world, and the music hooks you from the start. The film does a great job of telling the story of P.T. Barnum and his circus, and it also explores important themes such as diversity, inclusivity, and the importance of having big dreams. However, the film is not without its shortcomings, some of the characters could have been more developed and the story a bit more original. The film's portrayal of the circus, which is definitely not without its own controversy, is shallow at best. Despite these shortcomings, I still found the film to be highly enjoyable and would recommend it to anyone looking for a feel-good movie to watch with loved ones.
