


Trinity ISE II – Collaborative Task Pair Work 1

STUDENT A

- 1. You are the EXAMINER. You are going to read a prompt to the candidate (Student B). Remember, the candidate is responsible for maintaining the conversation during this part of the exam.
- 2. Before you start, you need to think of a backstory for the prompt.



Use these questions to help you create your backstory. Write down notes with your ideas.

What is your sister's name?	Do you have a good relationship with your sister?
How old is she?	Where is the wedding?
Who is she going to marry?	What type of wedding will it be?
How do you feel about her fiancé?	Have you discussed your feelings with anyone?
How do the rest of the family feel?	What can you do to resolve the situation?

3. When you are ready, read the prompt to the candidate (Student A). Use the information that you planned to answer their questions, but only tell them information that they ask about.

- 2. Before you start, you need to think of a backstory for the prompt.

My friend told me about a very strange situation that happened while she was on holiday.

Use these questions to help you create your backstory. Write down notes with your ideas.

Who is your friend? Where did she go on holiday? What happened? Why was it so strange? How did it affect her? How do you feel about this situation? What could have changed the situation? If you were there, what would you have done? What do you think will happen next? Do any actions need to be taken?
