



B. Of the functions above, which are most relevant to the Topic Task of the Speaking exam?


C. Use the pictures below to generate ideas of possible topics. Make a list.



D. Choose two of your topics and develop them. Think of 6 talking points for each one.


E. Which topic was easier to develop? Which talking points connect best with the language functions from A?
